Sermon Date: Sunday, September 10



For the last three weeks, we've been walking through Psalm 103. Today, we'll bring this series to a close by looking at the final four verses of this chapter. So far in our series, we've learned how God is the God of our benefit – He forgives our iniquity, heals diseases, and redeems us from the pit. We've learned that God is the One who pardons us and doesn't hold our sins against us. We've also learned that our God is a Father with a heart filled with compassion for His children. Today, we'll learn that God rules over all. He's not just loving and gracious – He's an all-powerful King.
