- 5. How does Jesus' role as our intercessor and advocate comfort believers?
- 6. What does it mean to be "more than conquerors" in Christ, and how should that change our approach to life's difficulties?
- 7. How does recognizing our identity as "deeply loved by God" affect our relationships with others?
- 8. Why is it important to respond to God's love with obedience? What does this mean practically?
- 9. How can we develop a deeper experience of God's love in our daily lives?
- 10. How can the certainty that nothing can separate us from God's love bring peace in uncertainty?
